

PACKING INSTRUCTIONS & LIST

Properly packing for your child's week at the farm is perhaps one of those most important things you can do as a parent to ensure their experience is fulfilling and fun. Having appropriate clothing for the farm environment ensures that they are comfortable, safe and free to enjoy what they are experiencing.

The following packing list is intended to make sure that your child has clean clothes for each day, a few spare outfits for days we really need to change clothes, and at the same time remove the mental hurdle of deciding what to wear. Each day has it's own "roll" so that we all start fresh, and we don't need to wonder what's clean and what's dirty.

For simplicity, we recommend packing three separate bags for your child's personal belongings:

#2 - NIGHT and BATH BAG

- 2 bath towels labeled with your child's first name and last intial. (We suggest a ribbon safety-pinned in a loop to the middle of the towel. These will be used to hang and identify your child's towel.)

- medications (place in a labeled Ziploc bag, to be kept in a locked cabinet in the office)

#3- BEDDING BAG:	Bed-wetting
 Please try to pack in a large cloth or mesh bag that can be laundered - to combat the possibility of bed bugs, we will put everyone's bedding bag and pillow in the dryer for a short period before each child's bedding goes into the cabins Sleeping Bag OR Twin Sheet Set Blanket One pillow Optional: one stuffed animal or item to sleep with 	 If your child bed-wets occasionally or regularly, please pack additional items to prepare your child. Children that may bed-wet will be assigned a bottom bunk. 4 age-appropriate pull-ups work well if your child does not mind this option. Or, send 2 waterproof twin bed mattress covers. 4 pairs of pajamas instead of just two

TIPS	Items to leave at home
 Tips Make every attempt to break-in all footwear prior to coming to camp to prevent blisters and discomfort for your camper Send clothes that can and should get dirty not brand new items if possible. Help your child be responsible for their belongings during camp by including them in the packing process. Lay everything out at home so each item is known by sight or has their name on it. If your child wears eyeglasses, we recommend a headband that attaches to the eyeglasses to help keep track of them while at the farm. Label or name tag every item of clothing with first name and last initial. Also label the three bags your child arrives with, plus the laundry bag, toiletry kit, pillow and case (Use masking tape and permanent marker for large items.) Although we shower every evening, we do not shower on Fridays so your child will carry the scent of the barn at dismissal. Please practice shower routines with your child in the weeks leading up to their visit.
